Policy Document – Uniform Policy

1. Introduction and Aims

St Peter's requires its students to wear school uniform. We believe that a school uniform provides a sense of belonging and identity whilst setting an appropriate tone for an educational setting.

In developing our school uniform, we have carefully considered what is required practically for classroom lessons or for sport, safeguarding and health and safety considerations, and our obligations under the Equality Act 2010, and we have taken account of the wishes of parents and pupils.

We have also considered the cost implications for families and different groups of pupils and sought the best value - we have minimised the number of compulsory branded items and regularly review tender to ensure cost effectiveness and affordability. We will avoid frequent uniform changes so that clothes can be passed on. We also have second hand uniform sales and offer individual support for families where there are concerns over affordability.

2. Uniform 2025-2026

2.1 All students:

White shirt with top button done up and shirt tucked into trousers or skirt. No tops showing underneath.

- Ties worn at a suitable length.
- Bottle green 'V' neck jumpers. Plain jumpers for Y7-11.
- Bottle green blazer with gold trim for Y7-11.
- Bottle green skirt (available from Monkhouse only). Hem of skirt must sit on the knee.

- With skirt, plain tights in dark green, black, flesh or natural colour, or socks in green or white.
- Trousers can be worn by all students. Must be black and straight leg style in a polyester/cotton mix. Cannot be of lycra material and cannot be tight or too skinny in the leg.
We recommend the following: Banner or Innovation (black label) for boys and David Luke for girls (available from Monkhouse).
All Y7 -Y11 students must wear the crested trousers (available from Monkhouse).
- With trousers, plain dark black or dark green ankle or knee socks (not white socks or trainer socks).

2.2 Badges

Year 7 - White

Year 8 - Burgundy

Year 9 - Orange

Year 10 - Light blue

Year 11 - Purple

All students receive a coloured badge at the start of each year to wear on their blazer to identify their year group. If misplaced they can be purchased at school for £2.00.

2.3 Shoes

Suitable closed black or brown leather shoes with a low heel. No boots, no trainers or trainer style shoes.

2.4 Top coats

- Waterproof, warm coats suitable for school wear.
- No leather, denim, coats with logos, sweatshirt material or hoodies allowed.

4. Second-Hand Uniform Sales

5. Appearance

If in doubt as to what will be acceptable, please contact the school before any action is taken or decision is made.

5.1 Hairstyles

- Hair must be one sober colour only. No highlights or contrasting blocks of colour allowed.
- No extremes of length such as length on top of head and sides/back shaved.
- No tramlines or other designs.
- The final decision on whether hair is acceptable will be at the discretion of the Senior Vice Principal.

5.2 Jewellery

- Students may wear a pair of small gold or silver metal ear lobe studs (only) one in each ear. They should be gold or silver in colour without any gemstones, real or artificial.
- Earrings are to be removed or taped up at the discretion of staff where they present a potential safety hazard.
- No other jewellery or piercings are allowed.
